SAYS HE PLANNED SUICIDE AFTER KILLING SPROUL

(Continued from page 1)

the revolver four years ago to do the deed. Why he had not tried to accomplish the act before he did not admit.

When Johnson took the officials to the scene of the murder he pointed out a large tree which he said he used as a target. The tree was found to be splintered. A cartridge box was found by the police similar to the one Johnson said he used. The box containing the revolver was found shortly after the crime in exactly the same spot that the alleged murderer said he threw it.

Feared Innocent Might Suffer.

"I made up my mind that I was working a lot of people there," said Johnson, "and I thought likely they would get somebody into it who was not concerned at all and get punished."

This statement was made during the course of a long interview with his counsel, D. W. Nason, County Attorney, and others at the Penobscot county jail Saturday afternoon.

"Rather than have that done you would go forward like a man?" was the question asked him.

"Yes, and speak up," was the answer. "Last night I was up there. I was talking with a man who works on the track and he said the detectives have been around here looking up some old letters with threats that were sent to somebody here, and this detective is looking them up. I thought they were getting some body else mixed up in it and the best way for me was to clear them. I could not see any other way. The girl up there is mixed up with the young fellow and he is mixed up with her and they are both mixed up together and it would be a pity to separate them, wouldn't it?"

Johnson described the effect of trouble with Sproul when questioned on this point.

First Trouble With Sproul.

"Well," he replied, "the first raid he made on me. I ran my tank over one time and threw a lot of rosin and scalded my hands and face pretty bad, and he came in while I was cleaning up. I did not stop to wash up but commenced to clean the floor and Sproul came in the door and commenced to laugh; and I turned around and he laughed and swore and said it would have been a good job if it scalded me to death, killed me. I cleaned up and got everything in running order. He had charge of the color room and I had to go there to look after my affairs, to see about the different things I was using. When he would see me go in he would follow me in and he would grab his little file and look at the same bill I was looking at and jump his shoulder against me and push me out of the way, and commence to swear and say, 'Why don't you go to your room where you belong, why come here and bother me; get the hell out of this and look after your own business.' I say, 'Mr. Sproul, I have just as much right in this room as you have. I had no authority from the superintendent to go there then, but I knew I had a right there. I went out and shortly after that I met the superintendent and told him how things were situated and he said, 'Sure, you have a right to go there and look after that account on the bill and I will see about it,' and he went right out and met Sproul and told him, 'You let John alone, he has as much right in that room as you have.' That set him (Sproul) wild to think he got snubbed."

"What was said after that?"

"It ran on; that made him so furious he watched for me and I was obliged to go there and I would catch when he would be away from the other part of the mill and he would go right by, see me come in and he would go right there

just the same and I got so I neglected going, not going any further than necessary, and he kept after me that way. I told him one time when he was going on that way: 'Mr. Sproul, you have gone far enough with this transaction and I would advise you to drop it where it is or somebody may get after you sometime and blow the top of your head off.' He called me names and came on and rubbed his fist on my nose and swore at me. I said: 'Drop it, now; I am warning you in time to drop it.'

Treatment Got His Nerve.

Johnson described the effect of Sproul's treatment on his nerves, saying that he became so confused at the last that he could not have performed ordinarily in the dark bothered him so that he would have to stand a long time before he could make out what valves to turn. This sort of treatment began several years ago and continued until Johnson was obliged to leave the mill. Before doing so, however, he again warned Sproul, saying to him: 'I give you tip now and it is not likely that I will warn you again. You have a chance to drop it where it is or abide by the consequences.' Sproul made no answer, Johnson declares, but kept right on with his persecution and finally Johnson left.

Regarding the purchase of the revolver Johnson stated that he bought it three years before he left the mill. He bought it in case of emergency, he said, but if driven to it he would have used it.

Bought Gun for Sproul.

"Did you contemplate at the time of purchasing it that you might use it on Sproul?" he was asked and he replied, "Yes, I did."

Two Shots Sufficient.

Johnson described the pistol practice on the river bank in Bangor and repeated the story of the events on the night of the murder which were told the police, earlier in the day, the story varying but little from his earlier statement. He added, however, at the conclusion of his description of the shooting of Sproul at whom he fired twice: "I could have given him a couple more just as well as not, but that was all he needed."

Asked where he went on reaching Bangor after the murder, Johnson said: "I thought he got clear of me and was in there (meaning the Scott home) and he was hurt and he might possibly come around all right; and rather than face him in court—he would have such a triumph over me—I went to the Boston hotel that night and got some weights there and tied them to myself, threw my hat in the river and I was just going to jump into the river myself and it came like a flash over me to stop and wait and see how the thing proceeded."

Prepared for Suicide.

Asked what kind of weights he had Johnson stated that they were "pieces of steel, cast iron and things." The steel was carried by him to the wharf, the others being picked up in the vicinity. He stated that the Boston hotel and a tugboat were at the dock and he went down to the stern of the tugboat. He told of going across the railroad and of injuring his foot against one of the rails; of meeting the flagman at the crossing and of telling him that he had been "away down there."

He did not mention meeting Officer Reagan on his way home that morning, but he admitted earlier in the day having done so. He also told of his visit

He declared Sproul had a revolver in the mill and kept it in the cupboard, where he changed it. It was quite a large revolver. He said he had never told anyone he was going to shoot Sproul or that he had actually done so, and he told the police Saturday. He denied also that he had any money as was reported, but that he had some at one time and owned a share in a three-masted schooner whose name he would not give. He said about \$8,200 when he left the mill, he said, but that was all gone, the last of it being paid for his lodgings at Orono, he said.
