The finance committee of the municipal
council met yesterday afternoon and paid
off the estimates for the year. They are
about the same as last year. Provision was
made for the appointment of a pathologist
to devote his whole time to work in the
hospital, and it was decided to assume the
responsibility of the oversight of the in-
stitutional commissioners and require them
in future to do all their financing through
the county treasury. It is figured that
the saving from this method would amount
to about \$200 a year in interest.
