WEEKLY COTTON LETTER

New York, Jan 14—The census report is sued today showing 11,087,442 ginned to January 1st, indicates a ginning for the last period of 388,960 bales, compared with 289,942 bales for the same period last year or 22,880 bales per working day against 16,979 bales for the period last year. This report is to be followed by two additional statements the first of which will be issued on January 23, and show the ginning to January 16th, while the final report will be published on March 20th, giving the amount ginned after January 15th, with an estimate of any unginned remanent. Today's report leaves a margin of 339,000 bales to bring the total ginning for the season up to the Government's estimate of 11,426,000 bales and as the actual ginning after January 16th last year was only 425,000 hales today's statement may not mean a total ginning so very much in excess of the government's forecast. We understand that the National Ginners' Association claims that ginning for this period includes 250,000 bales of thrashed cotton, which has not been allowed for in its December estimates placing the total ginning at 11,126,000 bales.
