## TOOK CHANCES WITH

### DEATH AND JUST WON

Old Woman Dragged From Railroad Track  
by Young Heroine.

WESTFIELD, Pa., May 6. — The engineering on the morning passenger train on the Central, between Ulysses and this place, narrowly escaped killing two persons.

As the train was rounding near Elmer, the engineer saw an old woman walking with a cane on the track. He sounded a warning whistle but the old woman plodded along with death at her heels. Suddenly Miss Alice Gundelman, daughter of the former ex-representative from Potter county, dragged the maniac woman from under the very wheels of the oncoming locomotive, whose driver had put on the air, reversed and turned his head so as not to see the tragedy.

The woman nearly run over was Polly Van Pelt, 90 years old. She never rode on a railroad train in her life, being afraid of the same, and yet who trudges along the track with much confidence as if it was a blooming meadow. Polly is a great pedestrian, and thinks nothing of trudging twenty-five miles a day even at her advanced age.

After this experience nothing happened to rack the nerves of the engineer. He approached this town, when he saw a man, whose time had suddenly become worth not less than a million dollars a minute and driving a white horse, try to make Smith's Crossing ahead of the train. The engineer was sure death rode the white horse. He put on the air, reversed, and with his fireman, looked away so as to avoid the sickening spectacle, but the "horse" won by about the thickness of a postage stamp.

These two episodes in a five-mile run had the train hands nearly "all in."

## PRIESTS IN UNIONS

### TO EARN A LIVING

Some Work as Gardeners and Carpenters,  
While Others Keep Bees and  
Sell Honey.

PARIS, May 6.—The Separation Act, which deprived the French Catholic clergy of official position and stipends, has led many to adopt curious forms of co-operation with a view to earning their living in Paris. The priests have formed a syndicate, the chief object of which is to procure coal and provisions at wholesale prices. There is also a federation of clerics who do manual labor.

Many priests who are capable gardeners and carpenters find employment from Catholics through this federation. Its members undertake to copy the celebrated socialist division of the day by giving eight hours to manual work, eight to clerical and eight to rest. In the Department of the Cher priests have formed a beekeepers' association and make a yearly income from the sale of honey about \$100, almost their former stipends.

WASHINGTON, May 6.—President Roosevelt opened the National Schuetzen Bund at Charleston, S. C., this afternoon by pressing a button at the White House, which electrically pulled the trigger that fired three shots at a target at Charleston. As understood here the president makes a score of 69 out of 76.
