LOW FARES FOR XMAS AND NEW YEARS

Special arrangements for students and teachers good for period of vacations.

Montreal, Que. - Special low fares with generous time limits for the return trip will be available on Canadian railroads for the Christmas and New Year holiday periods, it has been announced by C. P. Riddell, Chairman of the Canadian Passenger Association.

The low fare tickets will be good between all stations in Canada and also between Canadian points and certain United States destinations. Tickets for the return journey will be sold at the ordinary one-way first class fare and one quarter. These will be good for the going journey from Thursday, December 21st, to Monday, January 1st, inclusive, and will be valid for the return passage leaving destination not later than midnight Monday, January 8th, 1934.

Special arrangements have also been made for tickets for teachers and pupils' educational institutions, which will be good for the period of the Christmas and New Year vacations. The regular one-way fare and a quarter will apply for the return trip on these tickets.
