It is not improbable that the census burean report on the condition of the cotton crop, the figures of which were among the lowest for this period in history caused substantial selling, while the recent hardening tendency of money and expressions that the bull movement would reach a culmination before the convention of congress in December also led to realizing on a large scale. The reaction was warranted on technical conditions alone.
