TO BUILD STATION FOR NO RELIEF IN TESTING WOOD PULP SIGHT FOR WOMEN

Wausau, Wis., Aug. 25.—Contracts have been filed here for the building in this city of a government experiment station for testing woodpulp. A fireproof building will be erected within sixty days, as soon as special machinery is installed, the work of testing Wisconsin wood for paper making will begin.

Chicago, Aug. 24.—There is no relief in sight for women who have accepted the dictates of fashion and struggled under the unyieldings of hats of the size of an umbrella, that is the edict of the National Association of Retail Milliners, which is holding its annual convention here. Big hats are to be bigger and smaller smaller than ever before. There are to be no medium sized hats. The desire for extremes extends even to the coloring according to Mme. Matrie, president of the association. The more brilliant the coloring, the more nearly to the ideal effect will the new hat conform. New shades will include mauve, a shade of orange; daik, pompeian, a dead rose, a coral red, herne, a light mahogany, and a cajon, a raisin color.
