Boston, Jan. 12—A steamship service from this port to San Francisco by way of the Panama Canal will be inaugurated about March 1st, with the sailing of the steamer Juneau, the New England Maritime Corporation announced today. Six vessels will maintain the service with monthly sailings. San Pedro, the port of Los Angeles, will be a port of call.
Sank in Bay of Biscay.
Paris, Jan. 12—The French steamer Afrique, bound from Bordeaux to Dakar, sank in the Bay of Biscay, about 3 o'clock this morning, after a struggle to keep afloat since last Saturday, when she sprang a leak during the storm. Two of the doomed steamer's boats were picked up by the steamer Ceylan, with their occupants. Some rafts with survivors clinging to them were also seen after the vessel went down, it was reported by wireless.
A wireless despatch received this morning stated that the captain had decided to abandon the ship and that the crews of the Ceylan and the Afrique were working to save the passengers.
Goes to Mediterranean.

NEW NATIONAL PARTY URGED BY LORD BIRKENHEAD

London, Jan. 11—Immediate formation of a national party, including the Unionists and the remnants of the Liberal organization, to present an effective front to the Laborites is suggested by Lord Birkenhead in an article printed in the Weekly Dispatch. The lord chancellor believes the recent by-elections in Spen Valley resulted as it did principally from the absence of an organized party.
