Be it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows:

1. The following terms used in this act shall mean as Definition of Terms. herein defined :

(1.) "Section." That portion of territory the school or schools of which may be presided over by a Board of Trustees.

(2.) "Border section." A section embracing portions of two or more districts.

(3.) "District." That portion of territory the schools of which may be under the general supervision of a Board of Commissioners, except where the context shall exclude such definition.

(4.) "Rate-payer." Any resident of a section rated in respect of real or personal property in the county rate-roll.

2. The members of the Executive Council shall form a Council of Public Instruction, five of whom shall be a quorum. how formed.

The Governor in Council shall have power to appoint a superintendent 3. Provincial Superintendent of Education, who shall also be secretary to the Council of Public Instruction.

4. The Governor in Council shall have power to appoint a Frincipal of Principal of the Normal and Model Schools, at a salary not Model Schools; exceeding twelve hundred dollars per annum, who shall ap- salary &c. point such assistants, with the approval of the Council of Public Instruction, as may be found necessary.

The Governor in Council shall have power to appoint Commissioners. 5. seven or more commissioners for each district named in the annexed schedule A, who shall form a Beard of School Commissioners, of whom five shall be a quorum.

## COUNCIL OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

(1.) To make regulations for the conduct of the Normal powers of. 6. The Council of Public Instruction shall have power— School, prescribe the conditions of admission and graduation of pupil teachers, and appoint Provincial Examiners to examine the same at the completion of each term, for the purpose of awarding certificates to those found qualified; said Provin- Normal School. cial Examiners to receive three dollars each per diem while actually engaged in the work of examination, and necessary travelling expenses to and from Truro; and also an Examiner Chairman of District Examifor each district in the Province, who shall be Chairman of the ners. Committee of District Examiners.

(2.) To appoint, upon the recommendation of the Super-Appointment of Inspectors. intendent of Education, an inspector of schools for each county of the Province.

(3.) To prepare and publish regulations under which mo-Regulations for drawing money, neys may be drawn and expended, and teachers classified.

(4.) To fix the time of the semi-annual meeting of each Meeting of Board of School Commissioners, and call special meetings of any Board when deemed necessary.
