Father came from Shields, Eng. B. in Leith, Scot., 19 Sept., 1822. Was in business as a West Indian and commission merchant, but retired in 1875. Is Presdt. of the Acadia Fire Insur. Co., and of the Merchants Insur. Co.; Vice-Presdt. of the Chamber of Commerce, Halifax; a Dir. of the Union Bank of Halifax, of the Sydney Coal Mining Co., and of the N. S. Sugar Refinery; and was Vice-Presdt. (representing N.S.) of the Dominion Board of Trade. Was Presdt. of the Repeal League of N. S., 1867-68, and Provl. Treasurer from 15 Dec., 1877, to 15 Oct., 1878. A merchant. Was captain of sailing vessels for seven years. Is Captain and Adj. 3rd Regt. Guysborough Militia, and Consular Agent for the U.S. and Lloyd's agent at Guysborough.
