

Unusual firsts for York

Last weekend's Can-Am (Part 2) Squash Tournament, held at Dartmouth College in New Hampshire, provided a number of unusual firsts for the Yeowomen, who ended up third overall.

It was the first time since 1980 that York finished with less than second place, and the first time that the squad lost more matches than it had won. It was also the first time that York had to cope with a number of injured players which inevitably effected team play.

"It was a disaster for us," lamented coach Bob Cluett. "Not a totally unmitigated disaster, but a disaster all the same."

U of T captured first place honors with 41 points, while Dartmouth was a distant second with 31 points. The Yeowomen only managed to collect 28 points, while Williams College (Massachusetts) and Queen's were tied at 26 points for fourth spot, and Vassar was completely annihilated, finishing last with no points.

Veteran Yeowomen Ruth Castellino and Anita Halpern both suffered untimely injuries. Castellino, seeded number two in the tournament, won her first match, but during the second match she was hit above the eye. She was unable to continue her aggressive style of play and proceeded to lose her next four matches.

Halpern suffered a torn thigh muscle during her third game, but Cluett believes that both girls will be ready to play for next weekend's Ontario Interuniversity Athletic Association finals to be held in Kingston.

Despite the unfortunate streak of bad luck, Cluett is optimistic about the provincial tournament.

"Our personnel is as good as any personnel anywhere," he said.

"Even though it's been a snake-bitten six weeks where Murphy's Law has seemed to prevail, I still feel that the girls will be able to win next week."

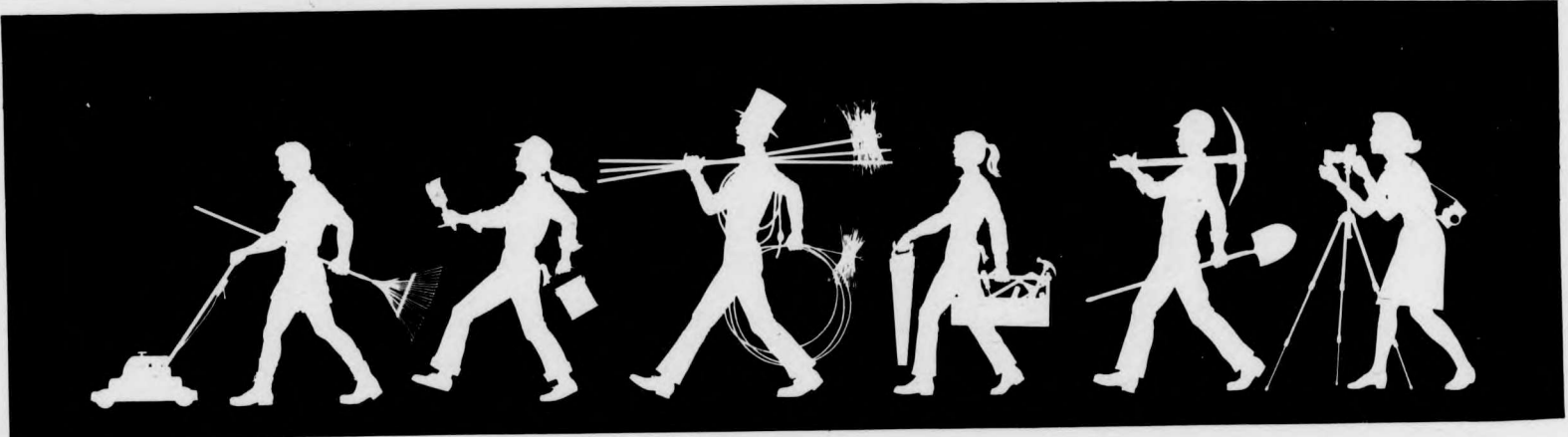
