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house at Oweege that they thereby might plainly see the intention <sup>44</sup> of the English to Creap in amongst them & y<sup>r</sup> Cut them off. the King of great Britain had now for three year solisted to the King of France to join with him to do the same But the King of France will not agree to it & y<sup>r</sup> building of the house at Oweego is a plain prove of what he has informed y<sup>r</sup> & told them to destroy of the P<sup>r</sup> house, & to bring an answer to the Gouverneur at Canada upon the matter. and if it was not done y<sup>r</sup> he would use means to do it without Delay

And on y<sup>r</sup> Departure y<sup>r</sup> Sachems of Onondago came to y<sup>r</sup> Caughnawage Castle, were the Caughnawage Sachems Speake to y<sup>r</sup> by a great belt of wampum & Beside y<sup>r</sup> Onondagos not to Consent to y<sup>r</sup> building of y<sup>r</sup> house at Oweego y<sup>r</sup> the buildings were of ill Consequence y<sup>r</sup> the English had built in the Moaks Country above Saragtoe, and that all the land in the Moaks Country was gone & that the Intention of the English was to Deprive y<sup>r</sup> of all such their Lands & that they Shoudt Consider in what a miserable Condition they may be brought to

And the Said Indian who hath given this Information says y<sup>r</sup> he is Inclined to Leave Canada & Come to live amongst us some were at Schenectady Saragtoe with Eight men with their families if he can be Supplied with Lands & Desired us to Acquaint his Excellency with the same & y<sup>r</sup> he may have answer upon y<sup>r</sup> matter in a Months time & give great Encouragement that a great many Indians would come to Live thereif there be Land & a multitude Minister y<sup>r</sup> Com. & are of Opinion y<sup>r</sup> f there may be had some lands within the bounds of Saragtoe) & y<sup>r</sup> of that matter can be brought to Effect it would be a great Security to this province & we thought our duty to transmit to y<sup>r</sup> Excellency we Remain with Due Respect
