by the 3^d clause of the 5th section of
the act 14310-100, ch. 59 an Indian
entitled to share in the property
of the band and by the same act
her descendants were also entitled
to share.

Charles E. Pearson, the eldest
son of Charles G. Pearson, by his
wife Agatha, before referred to, ap-
pears to have been born in 1832
and to have resided continuously
at Cooghuawaga from that time
to the present.

The provisions of the act 10915-100,
ch. 59, sec. 3, remained in force
without amendment until the
