Sir,

I enclose you herewith, a list of Halfbreeds who have, up to date, withdrawn from Treaty - In making the Payments this year the greatest care must be taken to prevent any such from drawing annuity money, and to assist you to do this, I have sent you the above list - Should you wish to know particulars regarding any one on the list, you had better write to this office -

In a few instances the Bands shown are those with whom the Halfbreeds entered Treaty, and with these the Bands, with which they last drew are written in red ink -

I would draw your special attention to Section 13 of my Circular No 209 of 20th July, instructing you not to pay any Indians from another Agency; the greatest care must be taken this year, as many, who have been away, have probably withdrawn at some other Agency, and will endeavour to draw money again on their return to your Agency -
