talking, was it dark?

A-247 No, sir.

A-248 It was pretty light.

Q-249 And you know he addressed his remarks right at you?

A-249 Yes, sir.

Q-250 And, asked you to stop talking?

A-250 Yes, sir.

Q-251 The first time, did he say that to you or did he talk to

A-251 No, sir, just me.
