

THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD **REGULATIONS.**

Any even numbered section of Dominion , and in Manitolas of the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 85, which has not been homestended, or reserved to provide word homestended upon by any person who is the homestended upon by any person who is the person of age, to the extent of one-quarter se-tion of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land offee for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for he district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$0\$ lies charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A sottler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the autondments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans: -

(1) At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homesical entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person reaking with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A sottler who avails himself of the provision? of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homestcader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestcader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give at months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION
