SATURDAY, the twenty-ninth day of the month of January, in the Twenty-second year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady *Victoria*, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland*, Queen, Defender of the Faith, being the Second Session of the Sixth Provincial Parliament of *Canada*, as continued by several Prorogations to this day.
