The London (England) Agricultural Gazette publishes the crop prospects for 58 counties in Fngland, Ireland and Scotland, and invariably the wheat crops is going to be a failure. Down the whole wheat column, "a thin crop," "light," "rather thin," "not average," "short and backward," "not promising," &c., are the general words used. This is in England and Scotland. In Ireland, however, the crops appear to be better, as such words as "a fine crop," "good," "very fine," "promising," and "very good," are used. Barley, cate and peas may be set down on the whole as an average crop. The hay all around is a light crop. The Sweeds have had to be invariably resown; the mangolds are excellent, and there has never been such promising prospects for potatoes. The wheat crop is the worst.

DARING TRAIN ROBBERY.

Kansas City, Mo., July 16.—The robbers who attacked a train at Winston last evening numbered six, under the supposed leadership of Jesse James. The men boarded the train at Cameron. When the train stopped at Winston they stood up in the aisle with drawn revolvers. One of the band advanced with a revolver in each hand towards Conductor Westfall and ordered him to bold up his hands. The conductor being slow in complying was shot through the heart. Another robber shot McCullough, a stone-cutter, of Wilton Junction, who turned outward in his seat. The robbers then went through the train to the express car, overpowered Messenger Murray, and intimidated him into opening the safe, from which \$5,000 was taken. The desperados then proceeded to the engine and told the engineer to start the train. This he could not do on account of the automatic brake. He was immediately utilized as a target by the robbers. The engineer put out the lights, crawled to the pilot, extinguishing the head-light, and lay down there. The robbers made no search for him, but departed. No attempt was made to rob the passengers. The populace at Winston rose en masse, and armed men are no weeking the desperados.

The two men shet rushed out on the platform, from which they fell together. Having secured possession of the train, one of the robbers ran to the engine steam was applied and the train started over the track at a furious rate or speed.
