PRIZE MONEY FOR SIGHTING SUBS

Glasgow Shipbuilder Offers Reward of \$100 for a Sharp Lookout

London, March 1.—Americans and others crossing the Atlantic can make a hundred dollars by sighting a submarine. Sir A. F. Yarrow, the famous Glasgow shipbuilder, writes to The Times that in order to encourage everyone to keep a sharp lookout he has offered a reward of £20 up to an expenditure of £10,000 to anyone on board a commercial vessel who first draws the captain's attention to an enemy submarine. The reward will be paid on the certificate of the person who first draws his attention to the submarine. The statement is to be signed by the captain, saying the submarine was actually sighted. Application should be forwarded through the owners to Sir Thomas L. Devitt, chairman of Lloyd's Register Shipping, 71 Pentonchurch street, London, who has consented to make the awards.

Business Men Wanted Associated Press. London, Mar. 1.—In the re-organization of the British consular service which is now under way special attention will be given to inducing business men to enter this branch of the government. It is said that the war has shown it to be imperative in the Government's interest to have in the service more business men with special knowledge of the requirements of British traders in the foreign ports in which they may be accredited. A committee of the foreign office is now at work on the re-organization scheme.

FRUITLESS DAY FOR PLUNGERS

Not Single Ship Sunk by U-Boats; Yesterday a Record HUNS MAKE OFFER To Replace Seven Dutch Vessels Sunk

London, March 1.—For the first time since the commencement of Germany's intensified submarine campaign the past 24 hours have brought no reports of vessels having been sent to the bottom by underwater boats or mines. The German Government, a despatch from The Hague says, has offered to replace the seven Dutch merchantmen which were torpedoed off the English coast last week with German freighters until the end of the war on condition that Holland purchase them afterwards.

A despatch from Paris says: An official decree published here provides that all steamships of more than 1,000 tons burden which are chartered by companies or individuals in France must have authorization from the Under-Secretary of Transportation in order to sail from a foreign port to any point other than a French port or to sail in ballast from a French port to a foreign port. Violation of this regulation will be punished by cancellation of the privilege of engaging in foreign commerce.
