LONDON, Feby. 10—An article attacking the submarine warfare, which was suppressed by the Germans censor last October, has now been published, "with the sanction of War Minister Von Stein," by the Kell Zeitung. The article was written by Dr. Struve, a progressive member of the Reichstag, who declares that the submarine war is a failure, and discusses at considerable length, "who was responsible for the unrestricted submarine warfare agitation and for the statement that England could be forced to her knees within six months. Dr. Struve asserts, after quoting a variety of witnesses, that the whole agitation was conducted and engineered by Admiral Von Tirpitz after the latter's retirement. The article then developes into an attack on Von Tirpitz and the new Fatherland party for "getting Germany into this difficulty," and closes with the assertion that the submarine warfare might have been a success except for the fact that Von Tirpitz while in office had neglected to build submarines in sufficient number to insure suc-
