POWER PRICES. If These Figures Are Wrong John Patterson Wants to Know It.

To the Editor of the Times: Sir,—Perhaps it would not be out of place to mention a few of the items that will go to make up the cost of the so-called cheap power from the Hydro-Electric Commission before it can be used by the City of Hamilton, and with your permission I will state them briefly, premising that the sum of \$22,500,000 is sufficient for the purposes intended.

The cost of 1500 horsepower, at \$17.50 is \$26,250,000. Expenses of step-down transforming, not including interest and depreciation, is over \$150 per horse power, or 6,750. Cost of operation, based on 10 years' experience, is 4,000. Maintenance, do., is 4,275. General expenses, do., is 7,800. Interest and sinking fund, on \$22,500,000, is 13,500. Depreciation at 5 per cent., is 11,250.

Total cost of power, \$44,515. This will provide at the lamp and distribution points 1,200 horse power per year and the actual cost per horse power to the city will be \$62.12.

I am willing to go into the details of any of the charges above mentioned and will cheerfully and willingly publish any correction that can be shown in my figures. I believe them to be less than actual experience will prove. Yours truly, (Signed) John Patterson, Hamilton, Canada, June 5th.

HUDSON BAY LINE. Deal With C. N. R. For Control of Rates.

(Special Despatch to the Times.) Ottawa, June 5.—It is understood that in lieu of the Government construction and ownership of the proposed new Hudson Bay Railway, as originally suggested, it is intended by the Government now to secure the construction of the road and control of the rates in an equally effective manner by entering into an arrangement with the C. N. R. Construction Co. for the line towards Hudson Bay, from the pass to the C. N. R. The Hudson Bay line is now completed to the pass, a distance of 480 miles from the Port, and a general survey of the rest of the route to the terminus has been made. The Government's plan is to extend it to the north-western cash bonus to the Canadian Northern Railway Co. to complete the road and to guarantee a portion of the bonds. In return the country will secure control of the rates on the road, running rights for all other roads over it, and the opening up of a vast new territory of nearly 100,000,000 acres of good land. No land grant will be made to the company, but the cash bonus will probably be somewhat over the usual \$6,400 per mile.
