Sec. 14-No sexton or other person having charge of a cemetery or burial place shall permit the burial of any person in such cemetery or burial place without first having received a certificate signed by a MEDICAL AT-TENDANT, a CLERGY-MAN, or TWO RELI-ABLE PERSONS cognizant of the facts, certifying to the death of the person for whom burial is required, and setting forth so far as is known the cause of death; and all such certificates shall be forwarded monthly to the registering offices con-
