This is a low average considering the extreme illness of the children and that all were practically opeless cases on entrance. Of the 23 now in hospital great gain and among the infants of the city benefit has been shown in their condition and the continued improvement is a splendid reward for this effort.

Voluntary Aid:—The cost of run-

ning the Hospital has averaged little over a dollar a day per child This low cost has been made possible by a large amount of voluntary labou in the nature of cooks, housemaids and V. A. 
