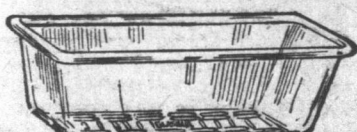

Yesterday's Explosion

ONE MAN BADLY INJURED.

The explosion which occurred on board the schr. Maxwell, at Monro's wharf, shortly after dinner hour yesterday, was a rather serious one, and one of the men, named Mason, was badly burned about the face and head, and is at present lying at the Hospital in a critical condition. Another member of the crew, named Delorey, was also removed to the institution, suffering from minor burns, but he was discharged after receiving the necessary treatment. The crew of the vessel had been engaged all the morning tarring the decks, and finding that the tar did not dry in as quickly as desired, they mixed some gasoline with it. The tar pot, with the mixture, was placed on a stove in the fore-cabin, and whilst the crew were alongside partaking of their dinner, the solution boiled over on the stove, causing an explosion. The force of the explosion was so great that the stove was lifted off the floor and smashed to pieces, portions of which were hurled in all directions, but fortunately no one was hit by the flying particles. The fire from the stove soon enveloped the fore-cabin, and it was while Messrs. Mason and Delorey were quenching the blaze with others, that they received the burns about the face and hands. Dr. Knight was hurriedly summoned and did all possible to alleviate the men's sufferings. After their wounds had been temporarily dressed, they were conveyed to the Hospital in the ambulance.

Two other men were slightly injured while fighting the blaze. The fire was extinguished without calling in the services of the Fire Department. The fore-cabin of the vessel was damaged considerably, while the members of the vessel lost most of their belongings. The vessel is owned by Capt. Delorey, of the West Coast. We understand from the Hospital this morning that Mason's condition has improved, and there is now every hope for a rapid recovery.
