Yesterday's Explosion

ONE MAN BADLY INJURED.

The explosion which occurred on board the schr. Maxwell, at Monroe's wharf, shortly after dinner hour yesterday, was a rather serious one, and one of the men, named Mason, was badly burned about the face and head, and is at present lying at the Hospital in a critical condition. Another member of the crew, named Delorey, was also removed to the instiution, suffering from minor burns, out he was discharged after receiving he necessary treatment. The crew of he vessel had been engaged alle the morning tarries the decks, and find-ing that the tar did not dry in as kly as desired, they mixed some me with it. The tar pot, with he mixture, was placed on a stove in the forecastle, and whilst the crew were alongside partaking of their dinner, the solution boiled over on the stove causing an explosion. The force of the explosion was so great that the stove was lifted off the floor and mashed to pieces, portions of which were hurled in all directions, but forunately no one was hit by the flying particles. The fire from the stove con enveloped the forecastle, and it was while Messrs. Mason and Delorey vere quenching the blaze with others, that they received the burns about the face and hands. Dr. Knight was urriedly summoned and did all possible to alleviate the men's sufferings. After their wounds had been temporarthe Hospital in the ambulance. Two other men were slightly in-

ured while fighting the blaze. The fire was extinguished without calling in the services of the Fire Department.
