Vertical Writing.

An Inovation Which Is Growing in Popularity.

More Legible, Compact and Speedier Than Sloping Style.

Vertical Writing Almost Antideluvianin England-Canada Speedily Becoming Permeated-London Teachers Who Use It.

This is pre-eminently an age of reforma-

This is pre-eminently an age of reformation and changes. On every hand ideas which have stood unassailed during a long number of years are being swept away, and the conward march of improvement has in the course of the past few decades been truly astonishing. Probably no effort to perfect an existing art is so worthy of consideration, should receive more encouragement, or destined to meet with greater approbation than the system of vertical writing which has recently been introduced into certain sections of Canada.

Vertical writing—a phrase which explains itself—is no new mode of transcribing thought to paper. Its present prominence is only due to a revival of interest. The origin of vertical writing is lost amid the obscurity of earliest antiquity. Certain it is that up to the sixteenth century such a thing as sloping writing was unknown. The Mexicans and Chinese yield the most ancient specimens of vertical writing, and in England, as well as throughout the whole continent of Europe, all penned communication was in this style until the time of Elizabeth. Then the sloping style of the Italians, commonly known as Spencerian, commenced to obtain. One of the chief points in favor of vertical writing is its extreme legibility in comparison with all other modes of chiography. And it is

cerian, commenced to obtain. One of the chief points in favor of vertical writing is its extreme legibility in comparison with all other modes of chirography. And it is peculiarly interesting to observe in specimens of Elizabethan penmanship which have been preserved the obviously sudden decline in clearness of form.

Interest in vertical writing of recent years was awakened by the publication in England of a volume by Mr. John Jackson, dealing with the subject. His ideas were here explained with a lucidity and power which commanded general attention. The knowledge which was thus imparted, and the interest which was generally awakened, has not since died out. Two years ago Mr. A. F. Newlands, supervisor of penmanship in the Kingston public schools, made a splendid exhibit of caligraphy at an exhibition of the Dominion Teachers' Associating in Montreal. This was all in Spencerian, sloping style. Through some agency he was prevailed upon to investigate and apply practically the principle of vertical writing. The latter he now teaches entirely, and his success, it is said, is something wonderful. His own style of penmanship, too, previously clear and beautiful in form, is now infinitely more legible and compact.

And these are two of the grounds upon which the superiority of the vertical writing is based—legibility and compactness. These characteristics are prominently obvious. No one who has seen specimens of the two styles side by side could reasonably confute this statement. Nor are these the only considerations of superiority worthy of note. There is a distinct gaining as regards speed. It is easier to puli the pencil than to push it; and, after careful computation, it has been assertained that the pentravels over 20 per cent. less space in upright than in sloping letters. Telegraph operators, in whose business celerity of transcription from the wire is extremely requisite, are nearly all vertical writers; and Thomas A. Edison, to cite a distinguished example, could take from 47 to 54 words in this manner in a minute. The hygienic excellence of the position assumed in vertical writing over that now in vogue must not be overlooked. The position at present assumed by people in writing is extremely productive of spinal curvature. A commission of eminent medical men at Vienna held recently has traced the responsibility to this unexpected source. In employing the new system the writer is compelled to assume a more healthful attitude, and at the same time a more natural position. The eyes, too, are not taxed to any such exert as formerly.

Vartical writing has not been officially adopted in the London public schools. Several of the principals, however, have investigated the subject. Mr. Alexander McQueen, of the Askin street school, is one of these. Last spring he made it optional with the pupils in his grade to use the vertical or Spencerian modes of writing. Nearly all the pupils are now using the former, and with surprisingly good results. Mr. McQueen showed an Adverniteer representative examples of both styles written by the same class of pupils, and the gain in clearness and e
