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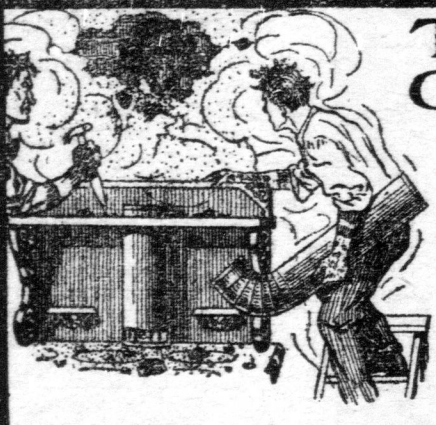

Want Government To Establish It Proposal Re Tuberculosis Hospital

Ma ter Now Before the Middlesex County Council—First Day's Session.

The first day's labor of the December session of the county council was short, consisting of about two hours' work. The time was chiefly devoted to receiving of reports and the reading of communications, a number of which were sent to the various committees.

A Government Hospital. The following communication from Mr. M. T. Buchanan, of Woodstock, chairman at a recent meeting held there in reference to the tuberculosis hospital, was referred to the special tuberculosis committee:

"Gentlemen,—On Nov. 28, 1907, at a meeting held in Woodstock, delegates from Brant, Perth, Waterloo and Oxford counties being present, it was decided to ask all county councils throughout Ontario to join in a united effort to induce the Ontario Government to establish one or more consumption hospitals in this province.

"With that end in view it was decided to ask the co-operation of all county councils, and to request each council to appoint one or more delegates to wait upon the Government at a date, to be fixed for that purpose, the intention being to bring the matter before the Government in such a forcible way as to induce immediate action on the part of the Government.

"It was originally intended that

an effort be made toward having a few councils combine for the purpose of establishing such an institution, but it was finally decided to try to make it a Provincial affair. Should this meet with your approval, kindly have such delegates appointed at your December session, and forward names to N. E. Burich, county clerk, Woodstock, who will advise them later on as to the time selected for a meeting in Toronto to lay the matter before the Legislature.

"A full attendance is much desired on the part of those who have started the proposition, and we ask that you appoint delegates to attend, so your county may be represented. This is a very important question, and every county should respond to the call, when the matter can be thoroughly discussed, prior to going before the cabinet ministers. Yours truly, "M. T. BUCHANAN, "Chairman."

confer with the committee of the council of the city of London, re tuberculosis hospital, beg leave to report that several meetings of the joint committees have been held since the last session, resulting in the final drafting of an agreement between the committees representing the city of London and the county of Middlesex, the terms of which were finally accepted by the committees, subject to the approval of the respective councils of the city of London and the county of Middlesex. A printed copy of this agreement was ordered to be sent to each member of the county council, a copy of which is hereto attached.

"At a meeting of the joint committees held on Aug. 31 last, it was decided to send a deputation to Toronto to interview the Provincial Secretary, to submit plans and estimates to him, and to endeavor to secure financial assistance from the Government towards the erection and equipment of the proposed sanatorium. The committee pressed upon the Government the equity of giving separate grants to each municipality, notwithstanding the fact that only one institution was proposed to be erected. The act provided that a grant should be given to any municipality towards the erection of such institutions, the maximum of such grant not to exceed \$4,000, but in view of the fact that the city and county were combining to build a sanatorium with capacity to accommodate the patients of both the city and county it would only be fair that each municipality should receive the grant from the Government of \$4,000.

"The Honorable the Provincial Secretary expressed his sympathy with the proposition, and assured the committee of the Government's deepest sympathy in the work they had in view, and of the Government's assistance to the fullest limit of the act. Since the last session of the county council, promise of assistance towards the erection of such institutions, the maximum of such grant not to exceed \$4,000, but in view of the fact that the city and county were combining to build a sanatorium with capacity to accommodate the patients of both the city and county it would only be fair that each municipality should receive the grant from the Government of \$4,000.

"A meeting of the joint committees was held at the city hall, London, to consider the offer, when it was moved by S. Oakes, and seconded by R. W. Jackson, that the offer of Mr. Blair, granting \$20,000, be accepted, providing the details of the trust could be arranged satisfactorily to the solicitors respectively of the city and county, to whom it was referred to draw the proper agreement. The city of London propose to submit to a vote of their ratepayers in January a bylaw authorizing the issue of debentures for the purpose of carrying out the agree-

ment with the county which was to pay \$5,000 as their share of the cost to be provided jointly by the city and county, the balance, \$4,000 is, by the agreement, to be provided by the county of Middlesex, and your committee recommend that this council take such action as may be necessary to provide their share.

Good Roads.

The following report on good roads was also received from the special committee appointed to deal with the matter. It was filed for reference:

"Your committee carefully examined the bylaw of the county of Wentworth in respect to the good roads movement, and found that owing to the amendments made to the act, since the adoption of their bylaw in Wentworth, that one for the county of Middlesex would have to be drafted on somewhat different lines. Your committee, in framing the new bylaw, were obliged to do so, without having received many replies from the different municipalities to the questions sent in the letter of the commissioner herein referred to. In the designation of a county system, your committee were of the opinion that it would not be wise to designate a larger mileage than the county could reasonably take care of, and with this object in view, the number of miles throughout the county are not as great as is comprised under Bylaw 580. The proposed system is, however, as extensive as in the opinion of your committee should be undertaken at the present time as further mileage can be added from time to time as occasion requires.

"Your committee recommend that for the efficient working of the bylaw for the improvement of public highways, that the management of the same be placed under the direction of the board of road directors and the county engineer; and in order that the said board of road directors may be representative of the various parts of the municipality, that the county be divided into four divisions, three members of the county council, to be elected from each division, and suggest that for such purpose the

said divisions be composed of the following groups of townships:

"Division No. 1 to be composed of the townships of North Dorchester, Westminster and Delaware.

"Division No. 2 to be composed of the townships of West Nissouri, London and Lobo.

"Division No. 3 to be composed of the townships of Biddulph, McGilivray, East Williams and West Williams.

"Division No. 4 to be composed of the townships of Adelaide, Metcalfe, Carleton Place and Mosa.

"The total number of miles designated is apportioned to the various townships within the county as follows:
