Washington, Aug. 10. — Giving Tiger and Senator fans their first opportunity to judge of the wisdom or fallacy of the trade consummated Wednesday night, Detroit and Washington clashed in the second game of the series to day, the Champions landing winners by a score of 6 to 1.

Each of the teams entered upon the struggle with a new face in its line-up. Herman Schaefer, veteran Tiger player, and Jim Delahanty, until last night a member of Cantonville's club, played against their old team-mates for the first time since the deal was put through.

Delahanty starred for the Champions, getting a run and a hit, and displaying some of his old-time speed on the bases. To prove that his days of usefulness have not entirely passed, the new Tiger stole three bases on Kahoe and Blankenship, his old club-mates.

By a peculiar coincidence, the second sucker's only misplay of the game was one which resulted in the scoring of the single tally that the Nationals got during the game.

Schaefer fielded his position perfectly for the Nationals, but in four trips to the plate the erstwhile Tiger captain failed to connect safely with the pitching of George Mullin.

The latter was picked to oppose Johnson in the second of four games to be played here. So far as hits were concerned, the Washington marauder had it on the Detroit twinner, but Johnson was wild, and it was this defect that assisted the Tigers in landing the victory.

Grand Rapids, Mich., Aug. 12.—The Eel drew a big crowd to the track this afternoon, and rewarded them by pacing a mile in 2:02 3/4, and coming back in 2:02 3/4, equaling his race record at Kalamazoo.
