ASK GOVERNMENT TO ENCOURAGE GIRLS TO WORK AT FARMING

Important Resolutions Passed at Women's Institute.

GUARD CHILD'S HEALTH

Special Grant To Be Asked for Rural School Inspection.

(1) "Whereas the Women's Institutes of Ontario have long been convinced of the urgent need that the Provincial Government should make better provision for the segregation and education of the feeble-minded, and whereas a feeble-minded exhibit held in Toronto last spring brought prominently to the attention of the public, the cost in money, the misery, and the appalling amount of crime resulting from our lack of care of the feeble-minded, and whereas there is a grave danger that many feeble-minded people will be immigrated to Canada from Europe at the close of the present war, and whereas the Women's Institutes of Ontario assembled in convention at London this ninth day of November, 1916, heartily endorse all efforts being made at the present time to secure a Government commission to investigate the whole problem of the feeble minded, and (2) desire that, if necessary, there be direct taxation imposed on the province for more adequate care of the feeble-minded."

(1) "Whereas the department of education, recognizing the urgent need at this time for larger production of our farms, last summer allowed their farm lands to be used by the women's institutes, and whereas the women's institutes, in their turn, have been carrying on a campaign to educate the public, and (2) desire that, if necessary, there be direct taxation imposed on the province for more adequate care of the feeble-minded."

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building up of a strong people for the welfare of the nation. The rejection of large numbers of men as physically unfit for active service, has impressed the responsibility of guarding the health of the children of the nation. It is possible for them to grow up robust, healthy men and women. Reporting upon the work along this line accomplished in the past year in rural districts of Ontario, Miss Hosson illustrated the need for medical inspection, followed up by the supervision of a school nurse. In Gravenhurst, district in three schools, 400 children were found requiring medical treatment, of whom 150 were suffering from throat trouble.

Follow-Up Work.
"Both a qualified physician to inspect and a school nurse to go into the homes and follow up the work are needed," was Miss Hosson's view of the matter. She recalled to the memory of her audience that in Scotland and England, following the South African war, there was an aggressive movement along the lines of school nursing and medical inspection of schools. To this she attributed the strength of the movement to conduct the war as they have been doing.

Speaking on behalf of the Canadian War Contingent Association, Mrs. A. T. Edwards, well-known to the Women's Institute workers through her association with the Red Cross and various war relief movements of the Women's Institute Club, referred particularly to a new work to be taken up in cooperation with the Provincial and Dominion governments, namely, assistance with the equipment of a hospital for tuberculous returned soldiers, which will be a wing of the present Byron Sanatorium. There already are 900 of these returned soldiers in Canada," she said, adding, "I am asking \$15,000 from the Western Ontario women for the equipment of the hospital. Arrangements are being made whereby each cot or ward will be named for a individual or municipality donating such. The Red Cross will not be disbanded when the war is over, not as long as there is a single sick soldier."

Referring to the work done in the past year, Mrs. Edwards told of 3,100 Christmas stockings sent off to the soldiers in the field and in hospitals, women all through Western Ontario having contributed generously to these. In regard to changes in work for the new year, she said that the new book of work for the year, attention was drawn to the knitted sleeveless sweaters to replace the long scarves formerly made. An appeal was made on behalf of the soldiers, for whom work will be done from now on, as well as the statement was made that the young men from this district have already answered the appeal for recruits for the British navy.

Mrs. G. F. Edwards, Komoka, presented a bright, concise district report with the statement, "The key-note all through the reports sent in to me to embody in mine, has been patriotism. We can't get away from these three ideas, home, country, patriotism. We must add a fourth, however. Among the more unusual features of the work of Institute branches to which reference was made, was a two-light story hour for children, inaugurated by the Parkhill Institute; a reading club at Forest; medical inspection of schools brought about by Institutes; and a program between Delaware and Mount Brydges, and a joint picnic."

Patriotic Work.
A short talk on patriotic work and from Miss Simms was much appreciated. She said, "I have seen 75 men have gone to the front. These staying here are bending their energies to every possible way towards patriotic work. At first, entertainments of various kinds were tried for raising money. The best method of all was found by from \$50 to \$300. Collecting old newspapers and magazines and sending them to the city to be disposed of twice a year, had also been found a satisfactory source of revenue."

A delegate from Dunnington, stated her Institute had raised in the neighborhood of \$200, of which \$250 was made on fair day by serving meals. A report in the evening, and the proceeds of songs sold. An autograph quilt netted 50, and 500 were taken in by collections at meetings. Two bales, valued at \$200, had been sent to New Ontario fire source of revenue."

A representative from St. Michaels told of the valuable assistance given by the children in three neighboring

schools in getting up entertainments, closing address.

Miss Lottie Sells of Sheddin, presided over the last session of the convention, in which a high pitch of interest was maintained from the first until the very last.

Regarding the sale of papers, one speaker stated that the revenue from the sale of papers and magazines had amounted to more than \$130 clear profit.

Several present spoke of the benefits derived from demonstration courses. An Aylmer delegate stated, "We found the domestic science course most successful. Our girls' class in the morning averaged in attendance from 50 to 75, while the afternoon class for women grew from 75 to 200. Everyone profited and there was no expense. We gave a supper at the close which more than covered the outlay."

Value of Bulletins.
Two or three also drew attention to the value of the bulletins sent out by the department, and particularly of the recipes contained therein, which they had used for canning vegetables.

Among resolutions of thanks presented by the committee on resolutions were the following: To the Red Cross and Canadian War Contingent Association for their letters, etc.; Mayor Stevenson, the city council, Women's Canadian Club, Industrial Commission, Philip, the musicians who assisted the military men who took part in the evening program, and particularly to Mrs. G. F. Edwards for her share in preparation of the program.

The members of the provincial committee in the western division, Messrs. Edwards, Komoka, Hastings, Elmer, and Trestain, Clachan, were re-elected.

Superintendent Putnam gave a brief

report on the work of the department during the past year.
