CLEVELAND, March 5 .- It looks very much as if Detroit will be in the League next season. The deal has been worked by Mr. F. K. Stearns, Presi-dent M. B. Nills and Manager Robert H. Leadley, and they say that it will be consummated. The and they say that it will be consummated. The Detroit people have made an offer to President Walter Hewitt of the Washington Club to trans-fer his franchises in the League to Detroit and re-tire. It is rumored that Hewitt has agreed. The Detroit people have pienty of money here on the ground, and it is generally believed that the deal will go through. One thing that stands in the way of the transfer is that it would put six cities geographically in the western circuit, leaving only four in the east. This would necessitate putting Pittaburg in the eastern circuit.
