FISH SUPPLY IN THE LAKES.

sh Almost Entirely Gone From the South Shore.

In a recent issue of the Buffalo the subject of the depletion of the fish supply in Lake Erie and Lake Ontario, and some of the causes which have contributed to this unfortunate

It did not require this comprehensive statement of facts to convince dwellers on the borders of these two great akes that the fisheries have declined in importance during the past ten years. As late as 1885 large catches of itefish were the rule along the south shore of Lake Ontario, from the Niag-To-day the catch of a single fairly adult whitefish off the harbor of Charlotte would be heralded as an unusual event, and the specimen would command a fancy price as a rarity. Sodue it is not uncommon to find two or three fair-sized whitefish in the seine, and at points further east along the shore they are still more common. As a commercial element, however, the chitefish no longer cuts any figure

along the south shore.

The condition of affairs in Lake Erie seems to be fully as bad, if not worse, the industry of whitefishing having eclined very rapidly during the pas few years, until it is now of compara-tively little account. The Times writer does not hesitate to ascribe the cause to the wasteful practice of netting baby" fish. It seems that it has been the practice to bring to the Buffalo market whitefish which were barely size and remitable dealers are charged with purchasing and selling these im mature fishlings. The lack of uniformity of the 46 2-3c, per day laws regulating the taking of fish in the lakes seems to be the chief obstacle to progress in correcting the evil, and a national law, coupled with an international agreement with the Do-minion, is suggested as the proper unfortunate, and that it works hard-ship to the people of moderate means, admits of no argument. Whether any plan can be devised which will remedy this dismal state of affairs, and restore these great food-producing sources to their former condition, remains to be seen .- Rochester Democrat.


