Jury Improvement.

An improvement in the jury system is brought to light by the demand of the Los Angeles prosecutor for two extra jurors on the McNamara trial. If they are chosen, the two men will sit with the jury of twelve and hear all the evidence. Then, in the event of one of the twelve taking ill before the trial is over, one of the substitutes will take his place in the box, and there will be no necessity to postpone the trial, or to have a new trial, as would be necessary in the case of the death of a juror. The constitution of California provides for alternate jurors, the idea being adopted from Italy. It is being practised in the present Camorra trial; and whenever a long-drawn-out trial is expected is a valuable improvement on the twelve-man system.

82 Years in Orange Association.

Kincardine, Oct. 26.—The death of Robert White, aged 99 years and 2 months, occurred here on Wednesday. He was a native of Ireland, and came to Canada in 1828.
He was the oldest known Orangeman in Canada, having been a member of the order for 82 years. He was honorary member of North Bruce lodge at the time of his death.
He was on the Platform at Kincardine on July 12th last, attending the big celebration. He will be buried by the Orange Order. He was a man most highly esteemed, and a member of the Baptist Church, and a Conservative.

Amherstburg Man Killed.

Windsor, Ont., Oct. 26.—Frederick Brae, 28 years old, whose home is at Amherstburg, was fatally injured when he fell from the window of his rooming house at Randolph and Atwater streets shortly before last midnight. No satisfactory explanation is given for the accident, but it is thought the unfortunate man was either walking in his sleep or was sitting on the window sill and lost his balance. The fall was from the fourth storey of the building, and so great was the impact that the stone sidewalk upon which the body struck was split in two. Brae was married, and his widow and two children live in Malden.

Attempt to Shoot Her Husband.

Chatham, Oct. 26.—With a seven-months-old child in her arms, Mrs. Mary Segree, colored, residing near Cedar Springs, was arraigned before W. G. Merritt, J.P., in the County Police court this morning on a charge of attempting to shoot her husband. It is alleged that the refusal of her husband to let her have the horse and buggy to go driving angered her, and she seized the muzzle of a musket standing in the corner of the shed. She was carrying a babe at the time. Her husband hurried away and laid the charge. She was remanded till Tuesday.

Suggestions for Cooking Potatoes

Soak old potatoes in water.
Never allow potatoes to stand in the sun.

Always pour off the water as soon as done and remove the cover to allow the steam to escape.

Baked potatoes should be rolled in a cloth till the skins burst. This prevents the potatoes from cooking too long, which makes them sticky and soggy.

Potatoes should be simmered (not boiled). It is a waste of fuel and spoils the potatoes. Too rapid boiling makes them a solid paste which is both unpalatable and indigestible.

Cook potatoes with the skins on as often as possible. They are more nourishing and palatable. Mashed potatoes are delicious cooked in their jackets, peeled and mashed.

Potatoes may be kept warm a long time without soiling, if the skins are broken and the kettle well ventilated.

Potatoes well ventilated while cooking are more wholesome and of better flavor.

By cutting off the tails of three generations of dogs, it has been found possible in Columbus, Ohio, to breed tailless dogs. The investigators are satisfied that by cutting the dogs' heads off for the same period barless canines will inevitably result.

Ten years ago there were thirty-eight cities in the United States and Canada having a population of over 100,000. Of these, the largest percentage of increase is credited to Los Angeles—211 per cent. Second only to Los Angeles, comes Toronto with a gain of 81 per cent., then Montreal with a gain of 75. Detroit shows a growth of 63 per cent. and Buffalo of only 20.
