

Croquets of Salmon.-Pour off liquid from one can of salmon, empty the meat into a bowl, and pick out bones and skin. Wash the meat as smooth as possible, moisten with a little milk, add pepper, salt, a tablespoonful of butter, and two eggs. Mix thoroughly and put on ice for two or three hours. When time to serve have grease boiling. With a fork separate portions of the mixture, rolling it in egg and breadcrumbs, drop in pan, and fry a light brown.
