

ART. XXVII.—A Week in Gaspé. Read in part before the Natural History Society of Montreal.



In 1843, Sir William Logan informed the writer of this article, at that time engaged in the study of the coal-fields of Neva Scotia and their fossil plants, that he had found in Gaspé a great series of sandstones and shales older than the carboniferous system, and probably of Devonian age, containing remains of fossil vegetables, apparently terrstrial, and a small seam of coal. Such an announcement awakened, as a matter of course, a strong desire to visit a locality so interesting, and to study this
