Whereas, it has been represented to us that certain persons within our Dominion of Canada, and without our License, are preparing or nitting out a mixed or military expedition against the fominions of His Majesty the King of Spain, to wit, against the Island of Cuba. And whereas we go on terms of friendship and amicable intercourse with Hissaid Majesty, and with his several subjects and others inhabiting within the Countries, Torritories, or Dominions of His Majesty, and whereas in and by a certain Act of the Parlament of our United Kingdom of Great Britain sail feeland, made and passed in the Session thereof, held in the thirty-third and thirty-fourthyear of Our Kuiga, and known as "The Foreign Edistanent Act, 1570," it is amongst other things declared and enucted as follows:

Prepares or fits out any naval or military expedition to proceed against the dominious of any thenly state, the following consequences shall

Every person engaged in such preparation or fitting out, or assisting therein, or employed in any capacity in such expedition, shall be gally of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by the or imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labor.
All ships and their equipments, and all arms and minitions of war, used in or forming part of such expedition, shall be forfelted to Her Hajesty. (i) Every person engaged in such preparation or

Now know ye, and we do by and with the advice of our Privy Council for Canada, hereby proclaim and strictly charge all our loving subjects to govern themselves accordingly, and to abstain from riolating or contravening the hereinbefore recited provisions of "The Foreign Emistment Act, 15%"

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that if the Chief Executive authority is said, and that there is a reasonable and probable case for believing that a Ship is about to be despicable contrary to the said Act, the Chief Executive authority shall have power to issue a warrant authorizing the seizure and search of sea Ship and her detention until she has been either condemned or released by process of law. And whereas certain powers of seizure and detentions as one of the real process of the said act oncertain local suborties.
