SHIPPING INTELLIGENCE.

The British bark Ariadne, 1,167 tons, Capt. Croot, sailed from London November 25 for Victoria direct with a general cargo of merchandise, consigned to Robert Ward & Co.

The Norwegian ship Morning Light, 1,315 tons, Capt. Johansen, from Melbourne September 26, arrived at this port December 4, making the passage in 69 days. She is in ballast, and chartered to load a cargo of lumber at Burrard Inlet for Melbourne, Adelaide or Pirie at 60s, with the option of Sydney at 50s.

The Titania has been towed around from Vancouver to New Westminster to discharge general cargo and afterwards load salmon. Bell-Irving, Paterson & Co., consignees.

The American bark Newsboy, 559 tons, Capt. Johnson, which cleared from New Westminster October 1 with a cargo of lumber from the Brunette Saw Mills, arrived at Sydney November 21.

Spreckels Bros., of San Francisco, are said to have purchased the tug Pioneer from Moore & Smith, of San Francisco. The Pioneer is well known in the Puget Sound and British Columbia waters.

The British bark Hawthornbank, 1,288 tons, Capt. Porter, has cleared for Tacoma to load grain. She docked at Esquimalt and had her bottom scraped and painted by the Puget Sound and British Columbia Stevedoring Co.

The British ship Celeste Burrill, 1,764 tons, Capt. Haynes, from Rio Janeiro, Sept. 18, arrived in Royal Roads, Dec. 4, making the voyage in 77 days. She is awaiting orders. The voyage was uneventful, no ships having been spoken.
