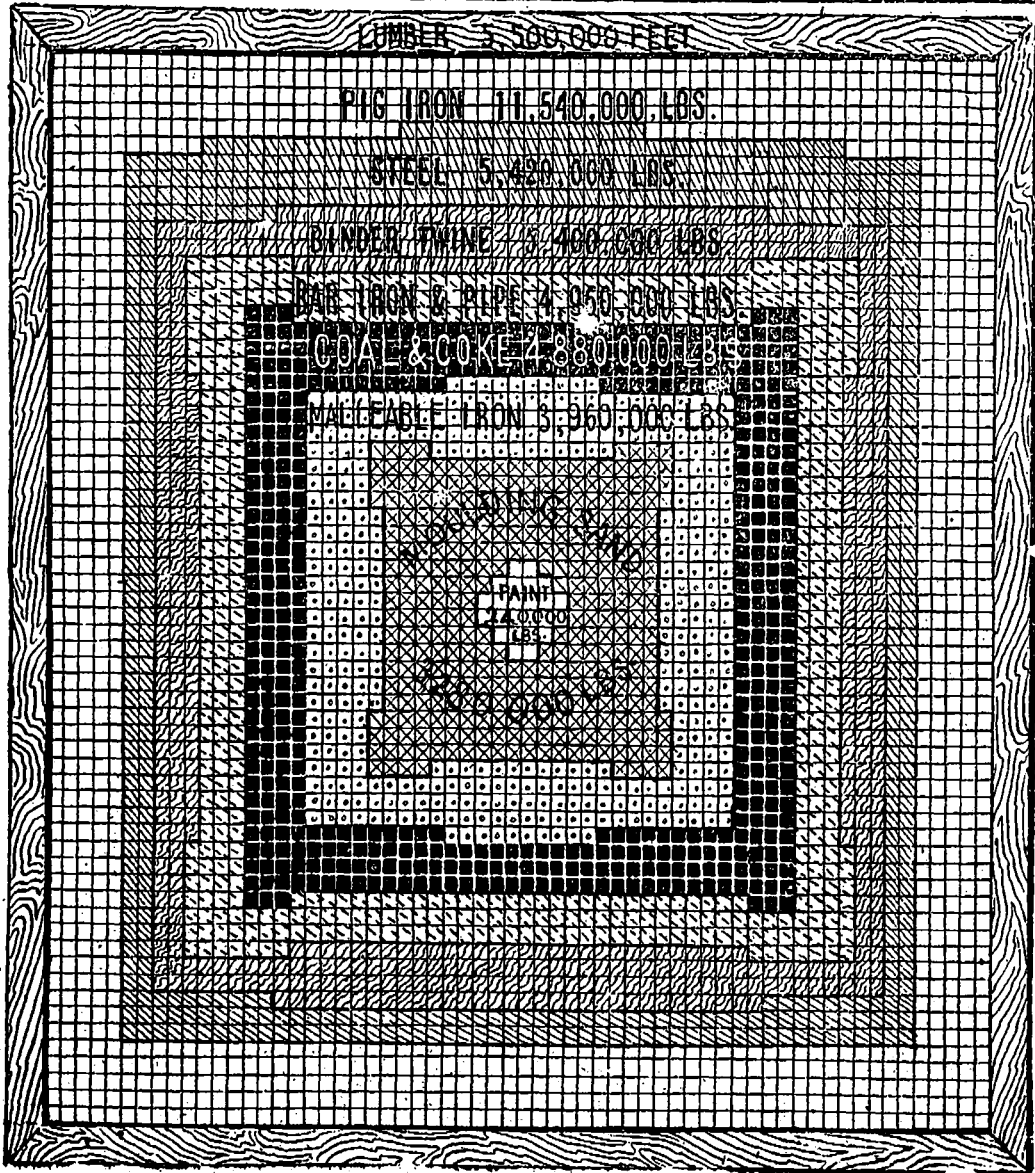


Diagram Illustrating the Enormous Quantities of

DIVERSIFIED KINDS OF MATERIAL USED.
In addition to the total of thirty-nine millions six hundred and eighty thousand pounds of material shown in the diagram, 5,500,000 feet of lumber are annually consumed, as indicated on the frame surrounding the chart. The consumption of Cotton Duck is 142,207 square yds. 600 barrels of oils, turpentine, varnish, etc., are used, and 600 kegs of nails. Besides these tons upon tons of other classes of goods are used each year, such as paper, 90,000 lbs; brass 32,000 lbs; tacks, screws, rivets, cotter keys, chemicals, leather, grindstones, fire bricks, and very many others too numerous to mention.
