## Article VI

The Royal Canadian Air Force may sell its surplus material directly to foreign individuals, firms or other entities without restriction as to type, quantity or value when the material is destined for export. However, individuals, firms or other entities authorized to conduct business in Italy who purchase such material for export will require authorization of the Italian Government. It is understood that if the Italian Government does not raise any objection to the sale for export within 30 days after the submission of the request by the Royal Canadian Air Force, authorization for the sale will be considered to have been automatically granted.

## Article VII

Export sales carried out on the basis of this agreement will be subject to existing Italian Customs procedures but the material involved in such sales will not be subject to Italian Customs duties.

## Article VIII

It is understood that the lire revenue resulting from the sale of surplus material in Italy by the Royal Canadian Air Force may be used by the Canadian Government for any expenditure in Italy or be converted into Canadian dollars for transfer to Canada, according to the regulations in force.

## Article IX

This Agreement is supplementary to the Agreement on Scrap Disposal of December 18th, 1961, shall come into force upon signature and will expire on the same date as that agreement.
