all around the damned Assembly and the bar. I went around looking for John around midnight. Then I suddenly saw him in the corridor just outside the General Assembly hall. JK: Because it had to be done very quickly.

Epstein: Yes, and nobody had really thought it through very well. So, poor Chi and I sat around. I was no help to John Holmes and he was no help to me.

JK: Hammarskjöld initially was not very enthusiastic about this proposal.

Epstein: He wasn't, but when Mike Pearson came back with the authorization from the Canadian Cabinet to provide forces for UNEF. He saw that the resolution was going to go through and he had forces to call on. Then he did a quick flip flop and I think that comes out in Brian Urquhart's book on Hammarskjöld. If it doesn't I've said it. Brian came in
