Royal Assent

I ask Conservative Members across the way to respond to me. We are dealing with 1,100 employees who will lose \$10 million collectively and this is no laughing matter. In the case of Canadian Arsenals, the Government backed down. In the beginning, the Government even forgot it had employees at Canadian Arsenals, but gradually it came around, recognized the mistake and amended the Bill. The Government changed the process completely after report stage and finally gave the employees what was theirs.

Let us be perfectly clear. We are not asking for any presents. We are simply asking that these employees be able to leave with what is in their own pension fund. They worked hard for it like everyone else. I suppose I will have to continue my remarks another time.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: I have the honour to inform the House that when the House went up to the Senate Chamber the Deputy Governor General was pleased to give, in Her Majesty's name, the Royal Assent to the following Bills:

Bill C-7, an Act respecting the National Archives of Canada and records of government institutions of Canada and to amend other Acts in relation thereto—Chapter No. 1.

Bill C-12, an Act to amend the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act—Chapted No. 2.

Bill C-6, an Act to implement an agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador on offshore petroleum resource management and revenue sharing and to make related and consequential amendments—Chapter No. 3.

Bill C-3, an Act to amend the Radio Act-Chapter No. 4.

Bill C-40, an Act to provide borrowing authority—Chapter No. 5.

Bill C-47, an Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money for the Government of Canada for the financial year ending the 31st March 1987—Chapter No. 6.
