No. 1.

By the Honourable Mr. Landry:—

November 22—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will be pleased to cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence exchanged between the Government and the Ross Rifle Company or any other association or military body or any person whomsoever, or between the various departments of the Government on the subject of the Ross rifle, of the inspections which it has undergone, of the improvements which have been suggested, of the complaints which have been made, or of the reports which have been made.

By the Honourable Mr. Landry:—

November 22—That he will inquire of the Government—

1. On the 1st November of the present year how many rifles had the Government accepted from the Ross Rifle Company (a) of Mark No. I. (b) of Mark No. II.?
2. Out of that number how many of each pattern were accepted since the 1st May last?
3. How much has the Government paid up to the 1st November instant for all the rifles which it has accepted from the Ross Rifle Company, distinguishing the payments made for Mark No. I. and the payments made for Mark No. II.?
