

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL A⁸.

An Act for the relief of Florence Elene Thom Ward.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Florence Elene Thom Ward, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, dental assistant, wife of Francis Hawkins Ward, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Westmount, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the fourth day of August, A.D. 1945, at the said city of Montreal, she then being Florence Elene Thom, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Florence Elene Thom and Francis Hawkins Ward, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Florence Elene Thom may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Francis Hawkins Ward had not been solemnized.
