Rev. Dr. Treacy on the Testimony of the Catacombs.

Continuing the Winter Lectures in the Oathedrai on Sunday evening. 10th, Rev. Dr. Treacy spoke upon the testimony of the catacombs to the unchanged purity of the Catholic faith. He said:

No matter how clearly history may testify to the purity of Oatholic faith and the unchangeableness of Catholic doctrine you will always find men ready and anxious enough to accuse the Oburch of having changed her doctrines and corrupted her faith. This we shall endeavor to do from the testimony of the early Christian saints and martyrs who have left behind them a written record of their faith in the Roman catacombs. To show you clearly that the Catholic Church of to day is identical in her doctrines with the early Christian Church, that she spreserved pure and unsullid all the saving doctrines of Christ and the apostles, I shall ask you to forget for a moment the roligious differences of Christian history, to the days of religious persecution when the saints and martyrs confessed unto death the true faith of Jesus Christ.

For example:

Eustachius, humble priest and sinner, the companion of St. Marcollus the martyr; pray for the repose of my soul and may God be your protecter.

The early Christians had the greatest devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pictures and paintings of the Blessed Virgin are to be found in every part of the catacombs. One of these paintings, according to Anglian testimony, was made before the years 80 A.D. Holding the Child Jeeus in her arms, over her head is the Greek monogram: "Mother of God." The boly secrifice of the Masse was offered in the catacombs there, and there is a striking confirmation of the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Searment to the serly Christians. In the catacombs, too, are paintings representing the ordination of young men to the pricethood.
