to unite them in a body for the defence of their lands and independence. Several unfortunate circumftances concurred to defeat this grand project; but it may be refumed, and it is not impossible but it may fucceed. Should this be the cafe, the English will be under a necessity of protecting their frontier against an enemy, that hath none of those expences to fussion, or evils to dread, which war brings with it among civilized nations; and will find the advantages they have promifed themselves from conquests made at the expence of so much treasure and so much blood, considerably retarded; at least, if not entirely cut off.
