It was last fall that Mr. Drew first went into Michipicoton, he remained there during the winter, and he has spent the summer there, and now he comes out with a splendid assortment of gold-bearing ore specimens. The World ex-amined these yesterday at the office of Currie & Kiteley, and they are certainly remarkable for the coarse grains of gold which stick out of them. One needs no glass to distinguish the yellow metal, for it appears in the rock in pieces almost the size of small peas. Wherever these rocks come from there is certainly gold in plenty. Mr. Drew asserts that Michipicoton is going to prove the "mining sensation of this era"—and that within the next twelve months. There are now several hundred men in the district and prelimi-nary development work is going ahead in good shape. So far the camp is decid-edly a poor man's camp, but the quartz is so rich in some cases that the owners are breaking it out and putting up prim-itive stamp mills of their own construc-tion on the lines of the old Mexican arrasters.
