PERILOUS, GRAVE, DANGEROUS IS THE SITUATION IN CHINA

No Fear for the Foreign Legations at Peking, But Europeans are Leaving the Place—Communication With Tien-Tsin Cut—Boxers Continue Raiding and Pillaging.

London, June 7.—The situation in China, as measured by abundant unofficial reports, continues full of interesting possibilities, but apparently it has not grown worse during the last 24 hours, since the favorite adjective of London and other official commentators is "serious," "grave" and "dangerous."
