DYNAMITE KILLS TWO

Farmer and Assistant Blown Up by Premature Discharge.

CORNWALL, Aug. 27.—(Special.)—Near Dickinson Centre, N. Y., while they were engaged in blasting rock in a field, Melvin Wood, a prosperous farmer, was working with an assistant named William McClure, clearing up some land, when a charge of dynamite exploded. Both were killed.

Carpenter's Bad Fall.—While at work at his trade on a bungalow, Alex. Broomfield, a carpenter, fell 25 feet and sustained injuries that may prove fatal. Broomfield plunged thru an opening in the floor to the cellar, tearing the scalp off his head and receiving internal injuries.

He was climbing out onto the wharf and fell backwards into the water and sank. His companions pulled him out at once, but he was dead. His parents are mourning their daughter in Saskatchewan.

Crowe of the Royal Field Artillery, who is a graduate of the staff college, and who entered the artillery in 1882.
