AMENDMENTS.

Constitution and By-Laws.

ART. 6 —Officers to be elected shall be nominated and seconded by members in good standing at the monthly meeting previous to the Annual General Meeting of the Society.—October 6th, 1894.

ART. 8.—All voting at any meeting shall be by open vote, except as here-inafter provided, or when five members desire the vote to be taken by ballot. The election of Officers and Council shall be by ballot, and shall take place at the Annual General Meeting of the Society, to be held in the City of Toronto on the second Friday in April in each year. All ballots to be deposited by voters in person. Candidates who secure a majority of votes cast shall be declared elected.—November 2nd, 1894.

By-Law No. 2.—All meetings of the Society shall be called by advertising in two or more of the Toronto daily newspapers, or by circular, or postal cards, or by any or all of these means, at the discretion of the President —December 6th, 1895.

ART. 5.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary, and Chairman of the Charitable Committee, who, together with the Past President and fifteen ordinary or life members, shall constitute the Council—five of whom shall form a quorum for the transaction of business; none but ordinary or life members of the Society shall be eligible for office or entitled to vote at any meeting of the Society.—April 15th, 1898.
