EVIL OMEN THREATENS HOUSE OF HOHENZOLLERN

New York, Feb. 7.—An American correspondent, writing of the war's effect on Germany, tells the following curious incident:

Staff and Membership

All self-supporting business women, whose homes are not in Toronto, are eligible for residence and club privileges, and all women living in Toronto for club privileges. The former class will pay out fee, and the latter at an annual fee of \$1.00.
