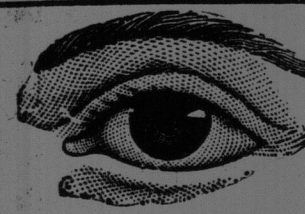

BAKED HALIBUT, SWEDISH STYLE

1 pound sliced halibut.
Salt and pepper.
Melted butter.
3-4 cup tomatoes.
1-2 teaspoon sugar.
1-2 onion.
1-2 cup cream.
Wipe halibut and remove skin. Place
in dish, sprinkle with salt and pepper,
and brush over with melted butter.
Cover with tomatoes and onion thinly
sliced, and bake for twenty minutes,
then pour over cream and bake for ten
minutes more. Serve at once.

POTATOES POLONAISE.

Slice thin peeled raw potatoes.
Sprinkle with pepper and salt. Melt
generous tablespoonful butter in bak-
ing dish. Lay on potatoes in layers,
pouring melted butter over contents.
Cover and bake in moderate oven until
tender. Turn on platter, sprinkle with
parsley, and serve. Delicious with
steak or roast beef.

LIMA BEANS TERMIERE.

Soak two cups dried lima beans for
twelve hours. Drain, put in casserole
dish and sprinkle with a pinch of salt,
and half a pinch of pepper. Cut a
small piece of salt pork into small
squares and render out. Brown in fat
one small onion sliced and one-half cup
of carrot cut in small squares. Add to
beans with two tablespoons of butter
and water to half cover beans. Bake
in slow oven.
A pinch of salt represents 205 grains.

FILLETS MIGNON.

Order small very tender steaks from
your butcher (quantity to suit). Ask
him to bind them with stripes of thinly
sliced bacon fastened with skewers or
tooth picks. Either bake or broil as
desired. Delicious for lunches.

CRANBERRY JELLY.

Cook until soft desired quantities of
cranberries with 1-2 pints of water
for each two quarts of berries. Strain
through jelly bag.
Measure juice and heat to boiling
point. Add one cup sugar to two of
juice, stir until sugar is dissolved, boil
briskly five minutes. Skim and pour in
tumblers or moulds.

WAFFLES.

2 cups flour.
4 teaspoons baking powder.
1-4 teaspoon salt.
1-4 cups milk.
2 eggs.
1 teaspoon melted shortening.
Sift flour, baking powder and salt,
add milk to slightly beaten yolks. Mix
well and add to dry ingredients. Add
shortening and fold in stiffly beaten
whites of eggs. Bake on waffle iron.

MINCE MEAT.

2 lbs. lean, fresh beef, boiled and
chopped.
1-2 lb. chopped fresh suet.
2 lbs. SUN-MAID Seedless Raisins.
2 tablespoons ground cinnamon.
4 teaspoons ground nutmeg.
2 lbs. SUN-MAID Seedless Raisins.
1-2 lb. citron, chopped fine.
2 tablespoons ground mace.
1 tablespoon each cloves, allspice and
salt.
Mix all together and add:—
2 cups white grape juice.
2 cups boiled cider.
2 lemons, grated rind and juice.
2 1-2 lbs. light brown sugar.
Mix well and add four pounds of
peeled and chopped apples, place in
stone jars or glass jars and let stand
at least a week before using.

MINCE MEAT FOR FAMILY USE.

2 1-2 lbs. fresh boiled beef tongue,
skinned and chopped fine.
4 cups sugar.
4 teaspoons grated nutmeg.
2 teaspoons ground cloves.
3 lbs. SUN-MAID Seedless Raisins.
3 teaspoons ground cinnamon.
Grated rind and juice of two lemons.
1 orange peel cut in small dice.
1-2 lb. finely chopped kidney suet.
1 teaspoon ground mace.
1 lb. SUN-MAID Seedless Raisins.
1 lb. citron, chopped.
2 teaspoons salt.
1 cup orange juice.
Mix all the ingredients and place in
a preserving kettle and cook until the
suet is clear. Place in glass jars, seal
and store in a cool, dark place. Clear,
fresh boiled beef can be used in place
of the tongue. When ready to make
pies add an equal amount of chopped
apples to the mince meat.

PUREE PAYSANNE.

Made by putting vegetables, as peas
and beans (Limbs), together with the
pulp of a turnip, one potato, one carrot,
one onion and one tomato, and cook in
three pints of the soup well seasoned,
then pressed through sieve.
